

Save the NAP from the International Allies

A Whistleblower Paper for the Delegates of the 2026 Libertarian National Convention

Executive Summary

The Non-Aggression Principle (NAP) — the foundational rule that initiating force against persons or property is illegitimate — is what makes the Libertarian Party *libertarian*. It is the moral commitment that distinguishes us from the major parties. It is what the LP Alliance is asking the 2026 convention to remove. On LPALive Episode 52 (LP Russia), Davis stated explicitly that the goal of international integration is to combat domestic Libertarian “isolationism.”

This paper makes three findings on the public record.

1. The LP Alliance is the operational layer of a militant cohort. Its founders publicly advocate armed confrontation with federal officers, identify as “antifa,” and have been forensically identified by LNC counsel as exfiltrators of the LNC membership database.

2. The LP Alliance is the U.S. domestic vehicle of the International Alliance of Libertarian Parties (IALP), a Switzerland-headquartered organization recently reconstituted on U.S. soil. Its co-founder describes it in those exact terms in private. Its principals concurrently hold IALP executive seats.

3. The IALP is the U.S. endpoint of a documented chain of U.S. and foreign government funding, intelligence-contractor personnel, and SPLC-coordinated information operations against the LNC — with documented overlaps to Macron’s Renaissance party in France and the Saakashvili-aligned United National Movement in Georgia.

Removing the NAP is the prerequisite for integrating the Libertarian Party into the foreign-policy posture and global political infrastructure of this network. The NAP is what stands between the LP and a redirection of its ballot access, brand, and members toward purposes the membership has never been asked to support.

Save the NAP.

Finding 1 — Who Is the LP Alliance?

The LP Alliance presents itself in public as a delegate-organizing inter-caucus coalition for the 2026 convention. The record establishes a different self-description, in the operators' own voices.

Phillip Rein is credited by LP Alliance co-founder Amanda Griffiths with founding the LP Alliance. On October 9, 2025, Rein replied on X to the question, "You think the LP is a militia?":

"It needs to be interfaced with one." [1]

The same Rein, in internal LP Alliance communications:

"LP antifa does have a ring to it. LPA if you will." [1]

Kyle Davis is the LP Alliance co-founder. He published on X on October 5, 2025:

"No, I'm saying we show up armed to the teeth anywhere ICE is showing up and the MOMENT they get out of line, we stop them. WHEN they become violent (because they will), we used the force required to stop them." [2]

Pierre-Alexandre Crevaux-Asatiani is the LP Alliance Strategist and the LNC's appointed Liaison to the International Alliance of Libertarian Parties (IALP). On his own public account, he declared:

"Hi. I'm Antifa." [3]

These are the operators on the LP Alliance organizational chart.

The LP Alliance formed in late November/early December 2024. [4] Within twelve months, it was running coordinated, sworn-of-record political operations across multiple states. On December 1, 2025, Kyle Davis swore under penalty of perjury in an affidavit filed in Case 2025CV154, Colorado District Court, that he is "a prominent figure of LPAlliance" and that he coordinated Colorado state convention operations. [5]

Kyle Davis, on the LP Alliance's own broadcast *LPALive Episode 13*, described how he had built a parallel data infrastructure:

"We keep watching LNCs come in, decide the way data has been done is stupid... and they blow it up and start over. That's insanity. I went through a lot of hoops to be able to get a database set up with persistent data on it without people being like 'PII stuff, are we doing things right.'" [6]

On May 13, 2026, Octillo Legal+Tech, independent counsel retained by the LNC, forensically identified Kyle Davis as the internal party who exfiltrated LNC members' personally identifying information. The breach triggered notification obligations after a sustained pattern of downloading was observed by forensic examiners. The forensic finding has been publicly reported. [7]

This is the cohort of activists asking the 2026 convention to adopt new bylaws and to alter or replace the Statement of Principles, including the Non-Aggression Principle. They present unambiguously as militant Neo-Liberals who see themselves as "Libertarian-Antifa".

Finding 2 — The LP Alliance Is the IALP

The LP Alliance is not a homegrown caucus but the domestic arm of a neo-liberal globalist network.

On July 6, 2025, in the LP Alliance's internal *alliance-chat* Discord, Kyle Davis described the actual identity:

"The Libertarian message is, and always has been, one of solidarity. Yes, @Amanda G. brought the term back into our minds and reinvigorated its usage, but it was always there. Somewhere along the way, we lost that in the US, trading for some odd form of isolationism."

"The organization HERE allows us to do work HERE for the IALP that significantly reduces the tax burden, even if everything is still hq'd in Switzerland. It's effectively a refounding of the group; a new organization. Similarly, we're extending the LNC to deal with it, hopefully, to focus on our international messaging." [8]

Davis's same message documents how the IALP integration was brokered:

"Steven [Nekhaila] put us in contact with Alexandre Crevaux-Asatiani, who was with LPF and knows Steven personally. Similarly, he is a French-born American-Georgian and member of the Girchi (Georgian Libertarians) who was tasked with re-writing the constitution with our help." [8]

Amanda Griffiths replied in the same thread: "**^All of this is true.**" [8]

Examples of personnel concurrently held in common:

- **Amanda Griffiths:** LP Alliance co-founder; IALP Regional Vice-Chair for North America. [9]
- **Pierre-Alexandre Crevaux-Asatiani:** LP Alliance Strategist; IALP Executive Committee; LNC–IALP Liaison personally nominated by LNC Chair Steven Nekhaila at the April 6, 2025 LNC Special Meeting (Agenda Item 11). [10]
- **Lana Leguía:** IALP Secretary General (announced January 21, 2026); LOLA Finance Director; New Jersey LP Vice Chair for Political Affairs. [11]

The IALP was reconstituted as a U.S. 501(c)(4) in 2025. The **LP Alliance Spending Committee LLC** was filed in New Mexico in the same period. On *LPALive Episode 52 (LP Russia)*, Davis stated explicitly that the goal of international integration is to combat domestic Libertarian "isolationism." [12]

Davis's reference to "the Girchi" spotlights a 2020 schism in the Georgian libertarian movement. The IALP-recognized faction is **Girchi – More Freedom**, led by Zurab Japaridze. On November 6, 2025, Georgian prosecutors charged eight opposition figures with sabotage and assisting a foreign country in hostile activities. The "foreign country" the indictment refers to is Ukraine, as confirmed by Saakashvili himself in his November 13, 2025 public appeal to Ukrainian President Volodymyr Zelensky for the status of a "civilian captive." [13] Those charged include Japaridze and former Georgian President Mikheil Saakashvili. Saakashvili's United National Movement (UNM) is the Georgian party for which Crevaux-Asatiani serves as Director for Foreign Affairs. [14] Crevaux-Asatiani was also recently appointed as a regional coordinator in Macron's Renaissance Party, the ruling French political party. [15] The astonishing overlaps and cross-pollination do not end there.

The same LP Alliance principals who helped draft the IALP's new constitution are now driving the rewrite of the U.S. Libertarian Party's bylaws and Statement of Principles, in coordination with foreign-party operators whose affiliated movements are presently subject to state-prosecution proceedings abroad.

Finding 3 — The IALP Pipeline Runs Through Atlas, NED, the State Department, FNF, FDD, Stratfor, and the SPLC

The LP Alliance is the U.S. operational vehicle of a documented chain. The **Atlas Network** is documented to receive funding from the U.S. Department of State and the **National Endowment for Democracy (NED)**, including financing of Atlas-affiliated organizations operating in Venezuela. [16] The **Europe-Georgia Institute**, the political incubator from which IALP Executive Committee personnel circulate, is jointly funded by the U.S. NED (since 2021) and the German **Friedrich Naumann Foundation (FNF)** (since 2018), per EGI's own published Partners page. [17]

Note: The Atlas Network is an Arlington, Virginia–based free-market think tank network founded by Sir Antony Fisher. It is distinct from The Atlas Society, an unrelated Objectivist nonprofit. The Atlas Society is not implicated in this paper's findings.

Atlas is funding the U.S. apparatus directly. Atlas Network is advertising a \$15,000 matching grant on the Project Liberal Foundation website. [18] Atlas paid LOLA, the IALP's Observer organization, \$105,000 in 2024 for "Economic Education." [19] Atlas was the published direct sponsor of LOLA's 2025 Europe Retreat in Warsaw. [19]

Examples of LP Alliance & Project Liberal Ecosystem personnel held in common at the executive level in Atlas Network–associated libertarian-oriented groups:

- **Tom G. Palmer** is concurrently Atlas Network EVP for International Programs, Cato Senior Fellow, Director of Cato University, former Vice President of the **Institute for Humane Studies (IHS)**, and Director on the Project Liberal Advisory Board. [20]
- **Joshua Eakle** is concurrently Project Liberal Executive Director and IHS Senior Director of Communications. [20]
- **Shikha Dalmia** is concurrently a Project Liberal Advisory Board member, LOLA North American Representative (IALP Observer), former Reason Foundation senior policy analyst, founder of the **Institute for the Study of Modern Authoritarianism (ISMA)**, and publisher of *The UnPopulist*. [20]
- **Jennifer Richmond** serves concurrently as Executive Director of the Institute for Liberal Values (overlapping into the Project Liberal ecosystem), Deputy Director of the **Foundation for Defense of Democracies (FDD)** (the neoconservative interventionist think tank), and is a former Vice President for International Projects at **Stratfor**, the global private intelligence and geopolitical forecasting firm. [21]

On August 30, 2023, the **Southern Poverty Law Center (SPLC)** published a Hatewatch piece based on leaked internal LNC communications, naming **John M. Hudak** on the record as their informant. [22] Hudak posted publicly: "I fucking love being an informant." [23]

Hudak holds a user account in the LP Alliance internal Discord server. [24] His Fakertarians podcast platformed LP Alliance organizer Phillip Rein (quoted in Finding 1) on Episode 57 (March 10, 2025). [25] The LP Alliance is now publicly floating Hudak as a candidate for LNC Chair. [26]

The same ecosystem funded on its right flank by Atlas, IHS, and Cato concurrently operates an information channel into the SPLC against the LNC on its left.

Atlas funds and trains the French think tanks (GenerationLibre, IFRAP, Molinari, with Institut Montaigne as elite-finance nexus) that generate the policy templates Macron's Renaissance government enacts. Operatives train at the Atlas Network Academy in Arlington, Virginia, then enter the **French-American Foundation Young Leaders** program, of which Macron is the Class of 2012 alumnus. Crevaux-Asatiani is Renaissance regional coordinator for Florida, Puerto Rico, and the U.S. Virgin Islands [15] and Director for Foreign Affairs of the United National Movement in Georgia. [14]

The LP Alliance is the U.S. operational vehicle of this ecosystem inside the Libertarian Party. It has exfiltrated the membership database, broadcast its operational intent against named LNC members and the 2026 convention floor in its own voices, and is asking the convention to adopt its bylaws and replace the NAP.

Save the NAP

The Non-Aggression Principle is what makes the Libertarian Party *libertarian*.

Before the convention is asked to ratify new bylaws, replace the Statement of Principles, or seat the persons named in this paper in further trust, the membership is entitled to know what it is being asked to ratify.

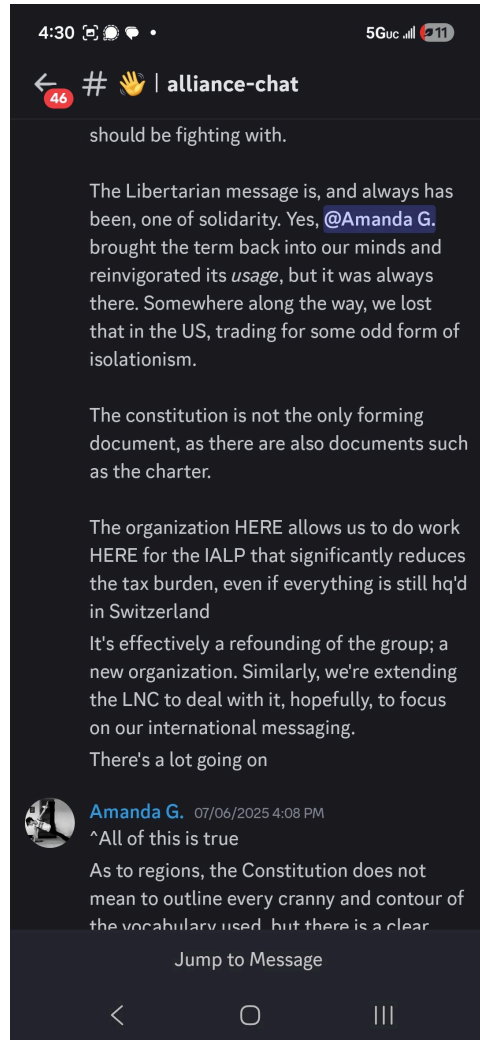

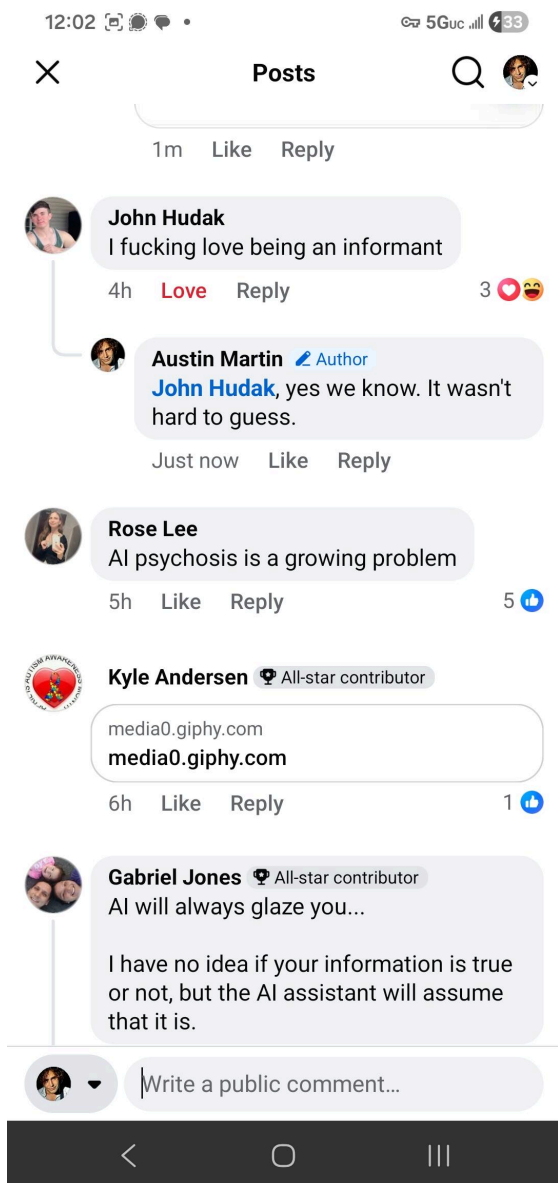

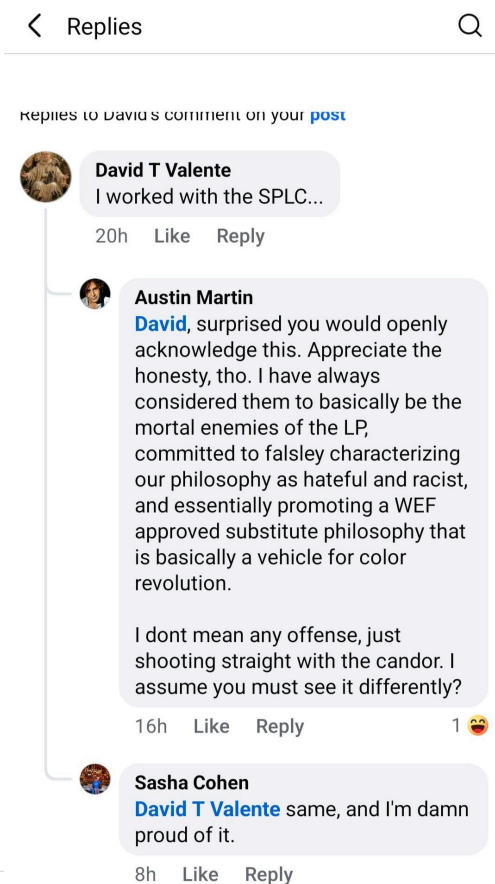

Whistleblower Disclosure

I cite one privileged document in this paper: the McMahon “CONFIDENTIAL: Data Leak” memo of February 19, 2026. The Octillo Legal+Tech memo of May 13, 2026, has been publicly reported and is cited from that public reporting. [7]

I received both documents in my official capacity as a sitting alternate LNC member. I cite them under a whistleblower disclosure because the convention floor cannot weigh what it has not been shown, and the membership is entitled to know what its own retained specialists have found about what was done to its data. I am filing this paper independently. I believe the LNC General Counsel is conflicted in this matter. I have preserved every document and exhibit referenced here and will cooperate with any properly authorized authority that requests them.
